

CARY B. FISH LODGE NUMBER 346, F.&A.M.



Cary B. Fish Lodge No. 346 was chartered April 17, 1963 to meet at Sarasota in Sarasota County. This Lodge meets in the Scottish-Rite Temple in Sarasota.

This lodge was named for M. W. Cary B. Fish who served as Grand Master of Florida in 1926 and entered the land of eternity August 12, 1941.

Cary B. Fish Lodge had one hundred and eighteen charter members. Sixteen of these received their degrees in Fish Lodge, U.D., forty-one were from six other Florida Lodges and sixty-one were from fifty-six different lodges in twenty-three other Grand Jurisdictions.

The six Florida Lodges were Leesburg No. 58, John Darling No. 154, Sarasota No. 147, A. W. Windhorst No. 185, Venice No. 301 and Temple Terrace No. 330. The charter W.M. and S.W. were from Sarasota Lodge No. 147, and the J.W. came from Venice Lodge No. 301.
